<p>ACTIVITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In art, first graders make signs to post up around school In science, fourth and fifth graders conduct “egg drop” experiments to demonstrate the importance of wearing a helmet while on wheels Classroom teachers can set up a <i>Frequent Walker</i> or <i>Frequent Biker</i> program—students receive points each day they walk or bike to school All teachers will remind students to LOOK ALL WAYS while crossing streets 	<p>ACTIVITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In math and science, second graders calculate how many steps it takes to get to the moon and log in steps to match that amount Third graders listen to an in-classroom guest speaker from local police department In English, sixth graders participate in an essay writing class—topic “<i>How to make our community more walkable</i>” Principal recruits teachers to start a <i>Walking Lunch Club</i> 	<p>ACTIVITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> PTA volunteers help to form walking school buses to school In PE, fourth, fifth, sixth graders participate in a <i>Bicycle Rodeo</i> Student volunteers pass out water, granola bars or other incentives to all students walking to school Local law enforcement increases traffic enforcement outside of school 	<p>ACTIVITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each class creates a banner to hang outside of their classroom Student council presents school crossing guard with a plaque and school jacket or certificate In history, third and fourth graders study explorers who walked across the US Kindergartners learn songs about riding the school bus and walking safely All teachers will remind students to WEAR A HELMET while bicycling, skateboarding or riding a scooter 	<p>ACTIVITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Health and Safety Fair</i> during lunch for all students <ul style="list-style-type: none"> » Each grade will host a safety game addressing a different safety issue Winners of the poster, essay and banner contests are announced and rewarded Students participate in <i>Traffic Safety Talent Show</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> » Each classroom does a skit teaching their peers about pedestrian safety
